The three-day sixth International Congress of Environmental Research on Environment Research, Planning and Management' to be hosted by Maulana Azad College of Dr Rafiq Zakaria Campus in association with the Journal of Environmental Research and Development (JERAD) began on Thursday.

Vice chancellor of Jain-ul-Abedin University of Malaysia Dr Yahaya Ibrahim inaugurated the conference while president of Maulana Azad Education Society, Padmashri Fatma Rafiq Zakaria presided.



Delegates arrived from different parts of the world for participating in the conference.

Dr Yahaya administered the oath to around 1600 delegates for the protection and conservation of environment and planting at least one tree in 2014.
